Informative narrative (Where does an animal live, what does it eat, what does it look like?)

Purpose: the student knows six ways to sign an informative story.

A third way (hooked hand shape) is unclear.
Sign order The story must be grammatically correct in SOV order, with correct use of mouthings and mouth gestures.	<u>All correct = 4 points</u> Half correct = 2 points None correct = 0 points	The student used correct SOV order in NGT, as well as mouthings and mouth gestures.
Fluency The student signs fluently, i.e. without unnecessary pauses, hesitations, self-corrections and does not use unnecessary fillers.	All clear = 4 points <u>Half clear = 2 points</u> Not clear = 0 points	The student did not sign fluent enough (hesitations, correction, unnecessary pause).
Story There must be a clear structure in the story, and it must be enticing.	All clear = 4 points <u>Half clear = 2 points</u> Not clear = 0 points	The story is not enticing/attractive enough. Attention is thus easily lost.
