





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DosjēDossier

Here you can put the work that you have done when learning other languages.

Choose work that you would like to show others; work which you like the best and work that has been positively evaluated by your parents, teachers and friends.

In the Dossier, you don't have to just put your work. You can put in copies and descriptions of what you have done, information about people who you have met from other countries and information about trips abroad.

Choose for yourself, which pieces of information and work you would like to put in your Dossier. For example, you can collect:

- written work
- completed exercises or their copies
- · different types of audio-visual recordings
- · words of songs, musical scores or recordings
- pictures and photographs
- emails
- · postcards, letters or their copies
- · lists of the books and stories that you have read
- the names or descriptions of the films that you have seen
- different language games and puzzles or their copies
- · lists of the words that you have learnt
- examples of project work or their descriptions
- · a selection of material relating to travel e.g. brochures, tickets, maps

Suggestions on how to work with the Dossier

In your Dossier, put the work that you have done in different languages and write the titles in the contents page, which has the heading: My First Work in Different Languages.

Every time that you look through your Language Portfolio think about what you would like to take out or add to the Dossier.

Think carefully about the best way to present your Dossier. You can organize your work in many different ways. You can choose from the suggestions below or come up with your own ideas.

- My work in.....language.
- My work inclass.
- My written work
- My completed exercises/work
- · My letters and my friends' letters
- A list of the stories and books that I have read.
- Films that I have seen.
- · Songs that I sing and listen to.
- My drawings, photographs, recordings and projects.
- · Words that I know.

When you have decided how to organize your Dossier, take a blank contents page. On the top of the page, write the title, write a list of your work and then organize it. Remember that you can copy the blank contents page if you need to.
